Dear Mr. Logan,

The following requires your immediate attention and response.

On May 14<sup>th</sup> I sent a public records request for “the quantity and date of mailing for each and every set of military ballots mailed for the November 2, 2004 General Election”. By June 15<sup>th</sup> I had not received any response so I sent a follow-up letter to which you replied on June 20<sup>th</sup>. On June 27<sup>th</sup> I sent a letter to you that explained in detail why the June 20<sup>th</sup> submittal was non-responsive to my records request. You replied on July 6<sup>th</sup> and then provided additional documents that I received on July 23<sup>rd</sup>.


You continue to be non-responsive to my original request. I specifically requested “the quantity and date of mailing for each and every set of military ballots mailed for the November 2, 2004 General Election”. All entries in the mail log except one show that ballots were delivered to PSI, a mailing contractor, and do not show when the ballots were mailed. In my original request I was very specific:

“If a mailing contractor sent military ballots provided by your organization, please provide the quantity and date that each set of ballots was transported to the contractor for mailing and the date or dates that each set was mailed by the contractor.” [Emphasis added.]

I reiterated this in my June 27<sup>th</sup> letter.

“Please note that my request specified that if a mailing contractor sent military ballots then the date or dates that you transported the ballots to the contractor should be provided in addition to the date or dates that the contractor mailed the ballots. Therefore, if dates in your outgoing mail log or e-mail records only reflect when ballots were transported to a contractor then those dates would only constitute a partial response.” [Emphasis added.]

Please inform me immediately whether or not you have records of when PSI mailed each set of military ballots. If you have such records, please make them available immediately for inspection and copying in satisfaction of my original May 14<sup>th</sup> public records request.
