4. In the fourth section of your letter, you ask that certain batches of tabulated absentee envelopes be made available to you first, after you finish your review of untabulated absentee ballot envelopes. Specifically, you ask to review "rebatch" batches and batches that appear on a list enclosed with your letter. Due to the way in which the absentee ballot envelopes are stored, we are only able to deliver them to King County Archives by pallets. It is likely that the batches you listed with your letter are within each of the ten different pallets that will be delivered for your review. As a result, we are not able to produce the listed batches together on a specific date. Again, we can only deliver the envelopes by pallet.
