***THIS IS TO CERTIFY** that the petitions, originally submitted on July 9, 2007, to the King County Records, Elections and Licensing Services Division, for Initiative 25, "Shall the King County Charter be amended to require that the county director of elections be a nonpartisan elected office?" have been examined and the signatures thereon carefully compared with the registration records of the King County Records, Elections and Licensing Services Division, and as a result of such examination, found to be sufficient under the provisions of section 230.50 of the King County Charter and section 1.16.100 of the King County Code. Specifically, 52,817 petition signatures were found to be valid, and this number equals ten percent of the votes cast in the county for the office of county executive at the last preceding election for county executive.*
