Dear Mr. Logan:

Thank you for your letter of July 14 in reply to my letter of July 5. In reference to the documents that you indicate will be available on or before Friday, July 22 – I will come to the Elections office to review those materials on Monday, July 25 after 9am.

I do not accept your assertions that (a) the production of *copies* of absentee ballot envelopes is an adequate response to my request to examine the original envelopes, and (b) that denying access to the original documents is necessary in order to protect the documents from damage or disorganization. You leave me no choice but to sue King County to secure my right to examine all of the requested documents.

In the meantime, I request to examine copies of all of the absentee ballot envelopes that were returned to King County in the November 2004 general election. Because of the time required to copy such a large number of documents, I ask that you respond with a reasonable schedule for me to review all of these documents in increments as they are copied. (by way of example: “20,000 additional envelopes to be made available each business day over the course of 30 consecutive business days commencing Tuesday, July 26”) I ask to review these envelopes in the following order, and in whole batches to the extent that they are organized in batches. Note that I do not wish to purchase any of these copies unless specifically requested. I also request that a copy of the corresponding batch slip be produced along with each batch.

- (1) All of the returned absentee ballots that were rejected prior to verification and not tabulated.
- (2) Concurrently, envelopes from both:
 - a. All of the PSI batches from the 46th legislative district, with the exception of the batches that were produced on June 24. Please find attached for your convenience a list of the other batches which I believe to be composed of ballots from the 46th. If KCREALS records indicate that there are additional PSI batches from the 46th, please include those in this set as well.
 - b. All of the “rebatch” batches
- (3) All of the “in-house” batches, with the exception of 3051, which was produced on June 24.
- (4) All of the remaining ballot envelopes not specified in (1) – (3).
